Programs

Full Time Care- Full-day child care is provided for working parents, active duty, and DOD civilians Monday through Friday, and closed Federal Holidays. Fees are determined by total family income as defined by the Department of Defense. Hourly care is provided in centers on an available space basis.

Hourly Care- The program is offered to eligible children on an 'as needed basis.' The current rates for this service are \$4.00 an hour.

Please call 937-656-8684 for reservations as availability is limited.

Special Care Requirements

The CDC tries to accommodate reasonable special care requirements. A medical evaluation by a physician is required for special care requirements. Children, who are identified with allergy/intolerance, are provided meals/snacks which meet their dietary needs and are in accordance with USDA. Documentation to include substitution and exposure plan is on file from the child's healthcare provider. Children who have been identified with a special need(s) are provided services within CYP when reasonable accommodations can be met. Prior to enrolling in CYP, the child's development and/or medical requirements have been revised by the Inclusion Team Review Panel. Special needs is defined as children with or at risk of disabilities, chronic illness and/or physical development, behavioral or emotional conditions requiring additional and/or related services.

Enrollment for Care Requirements

The Resource and Referral Coordinator can provide information about our full range of services that include applications for weekly care, before and after school programs, summer camps, and family child care. Parents must be able to provide the following items at orientation:

- Completed DD2606 Request for care
- LES/pay stubs of every adult household member
- Medical evaluation by your child's medical physician is required for special need requirements.
- Child's up to date immunizations

Meals

Readmission Policy

The program uses the current version of The American Academy of Pediatrics managing Infectious Diseases in Child Care and School for exclusion criteria and readmission guidelines.

Medication Policy

Medications are administered in a way that protects children. The AF CYP Medication Administration Instructional Guide is followed. Staff is trained on how to administer different types of medication.



Parent Advisory Board

The Parent Advisory Board/Involvement is a committee of all the CDC programs in conjunction with other CYP's. The DAB acts only in an advisory capacity, providing recommendations for improving services. The chairperson of the DAB is a parent.



Licensing

Our centers are inspected and certified annually by the Department of defense and the Department of the Air Force. Our programs are also accredited by the National Association for education of young children.
